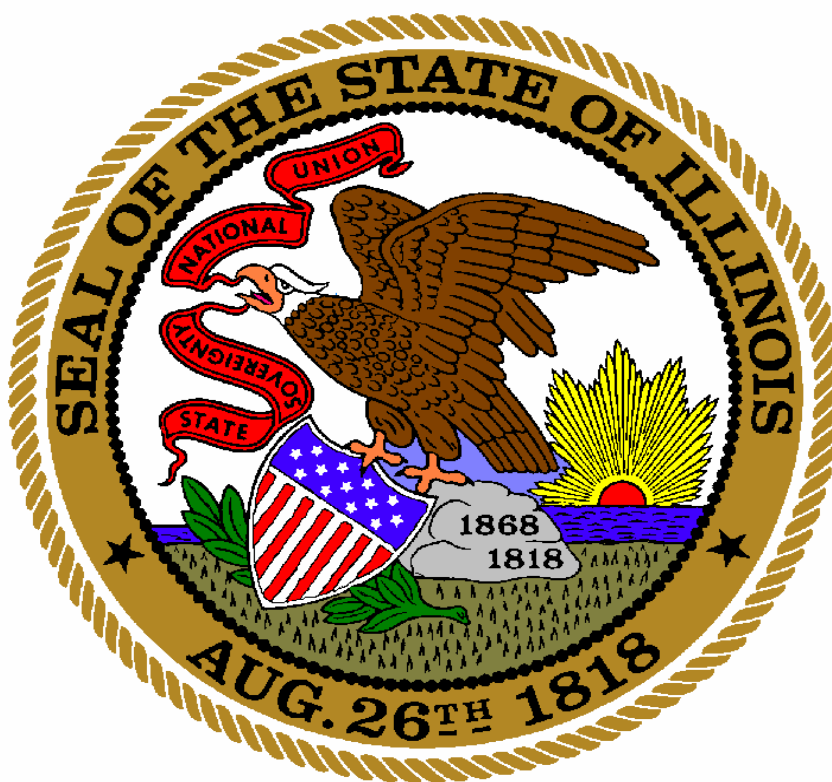
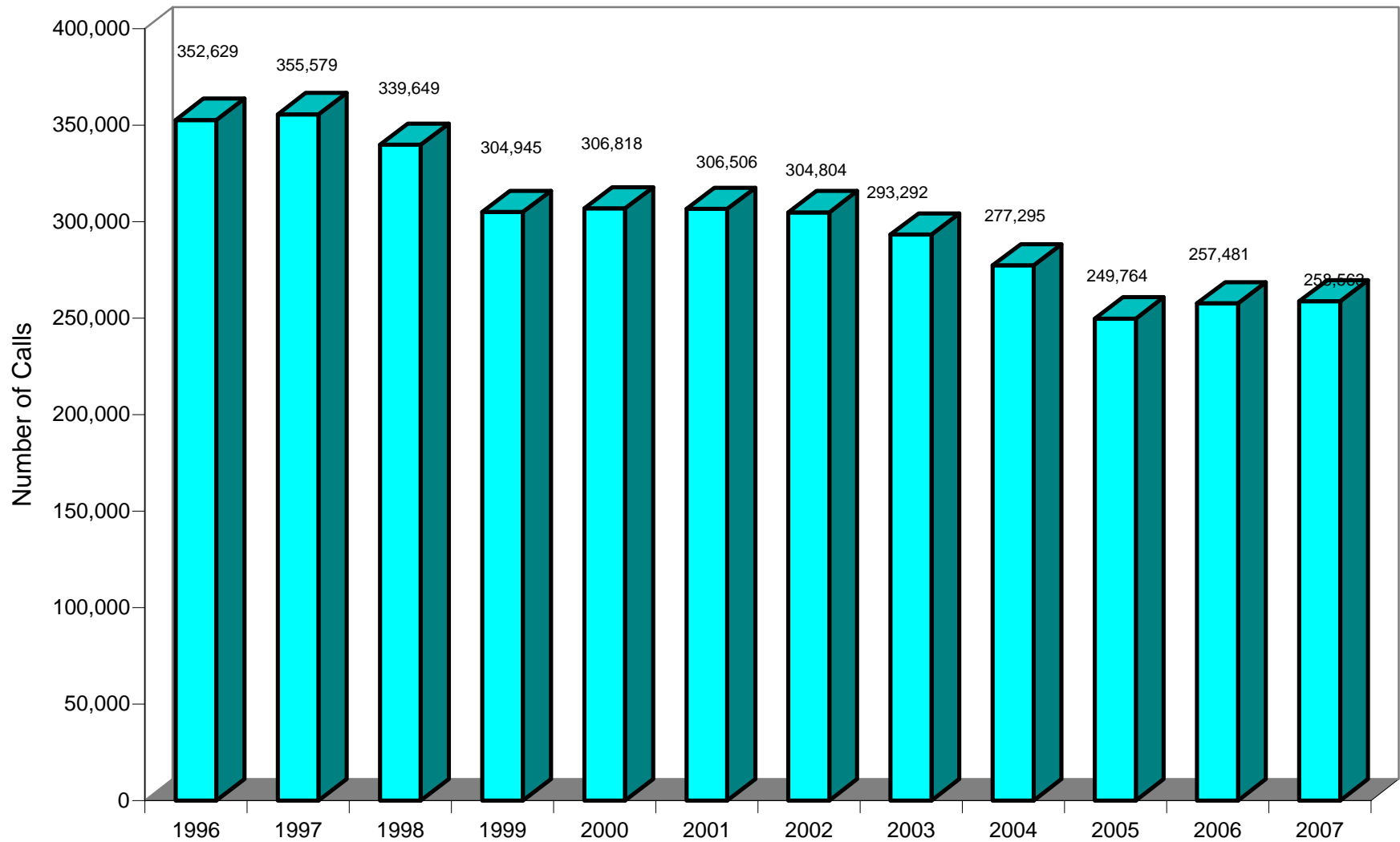

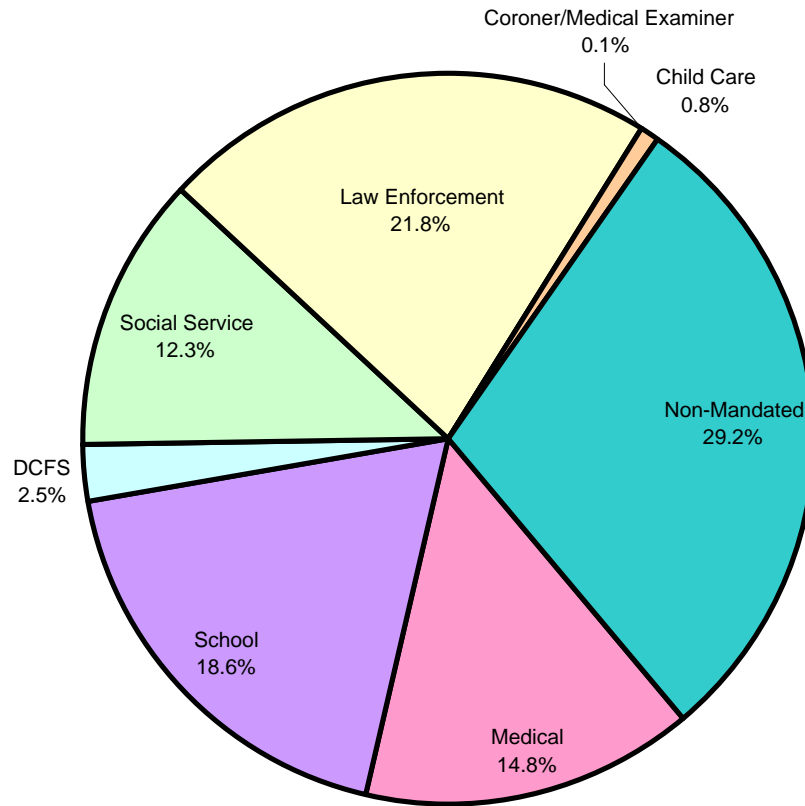

**Fiscal Year 2007**



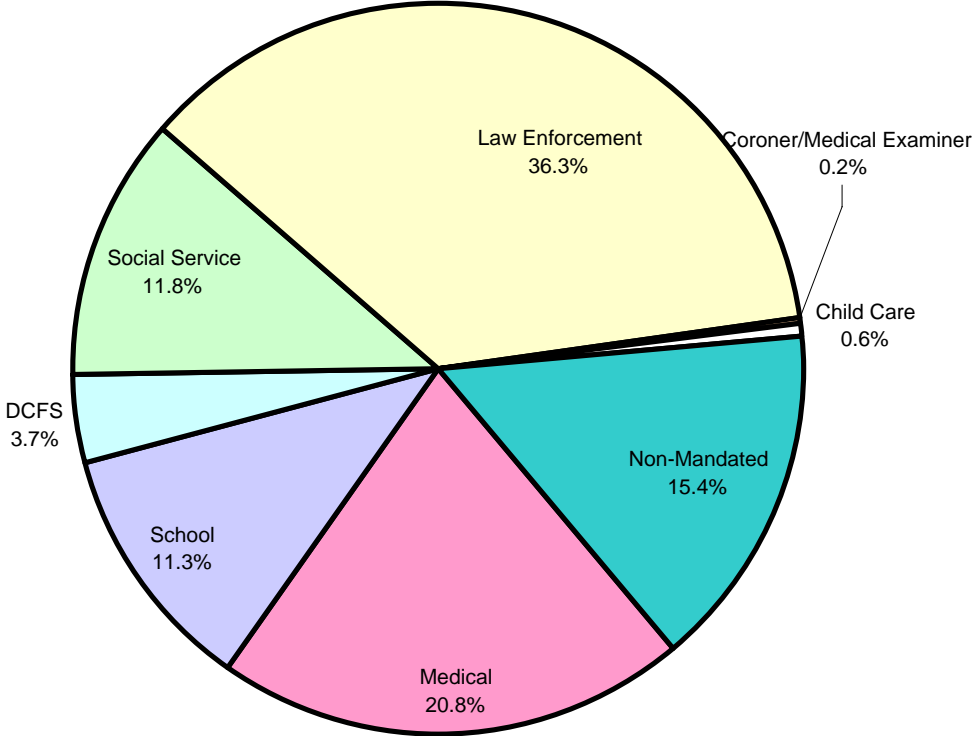
