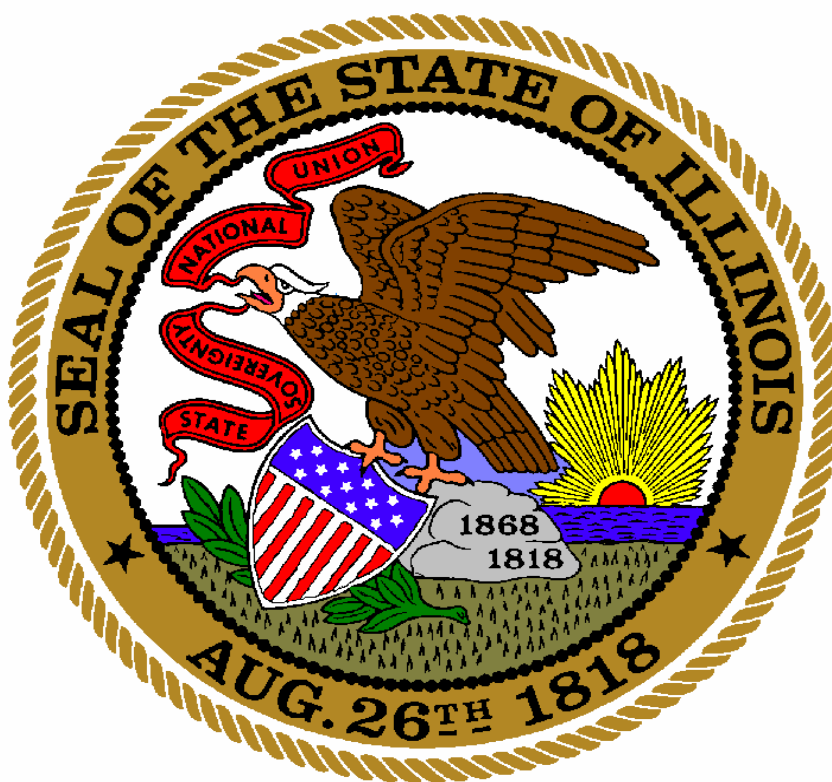

Fiscal Years 2000-2010

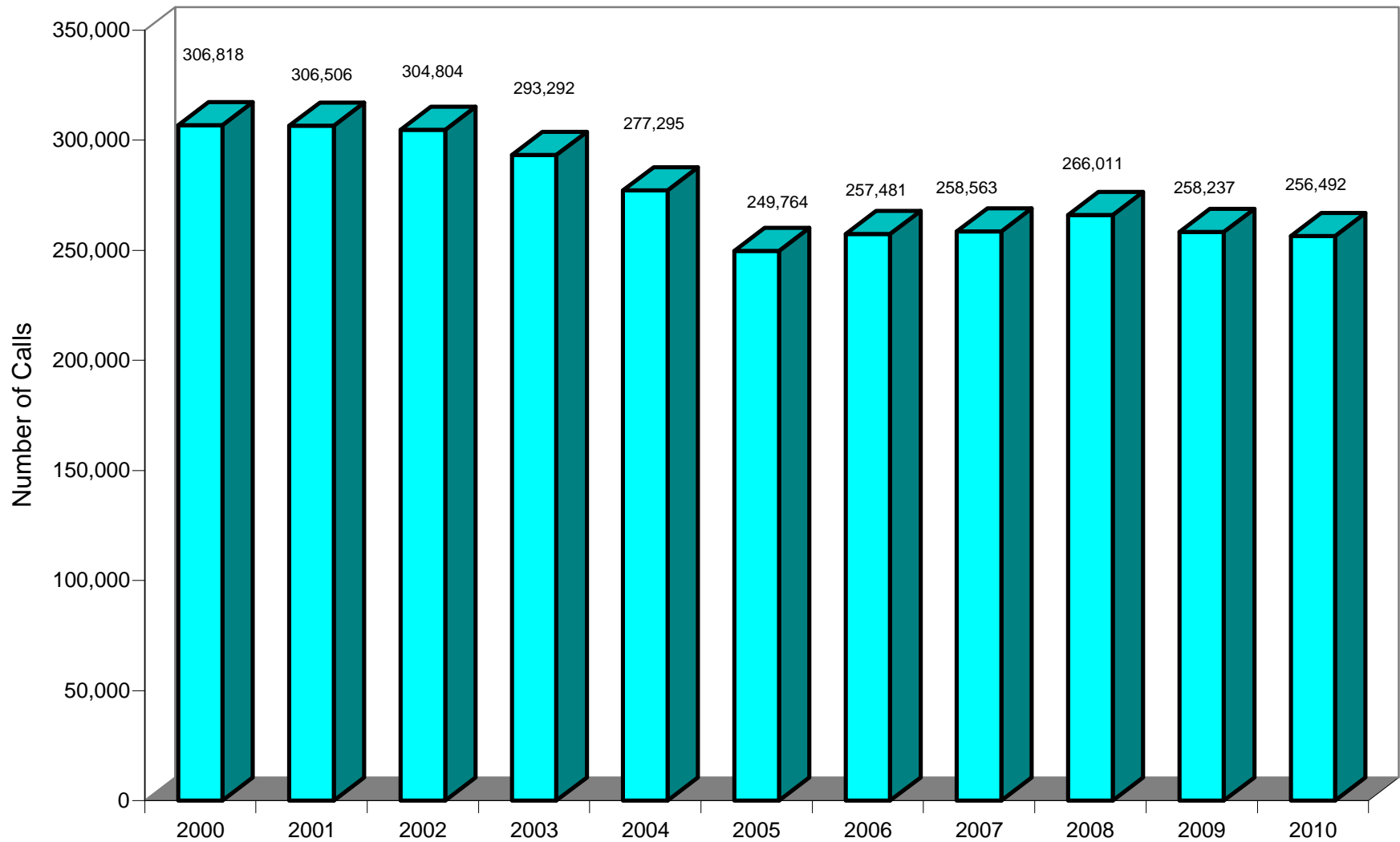

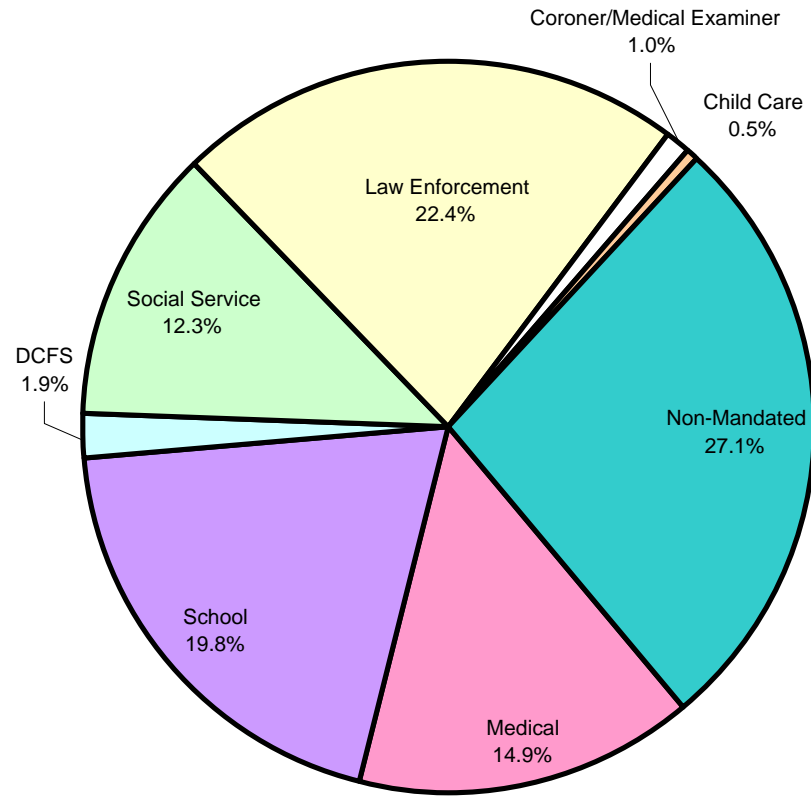

Fiscal Year 2010

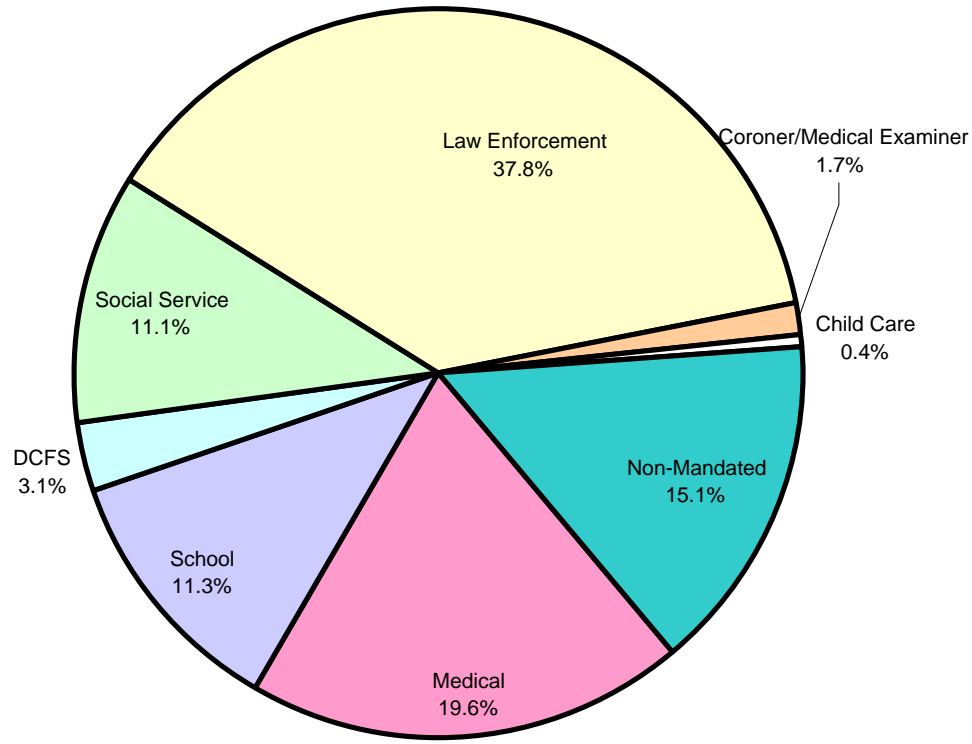

Fiscal Year 2010

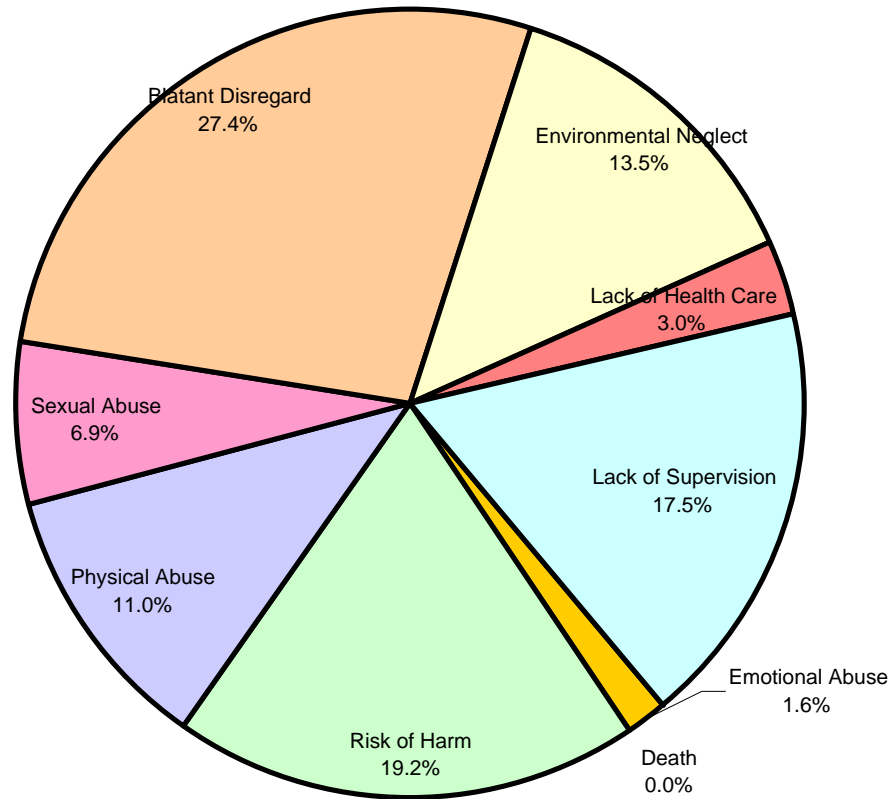
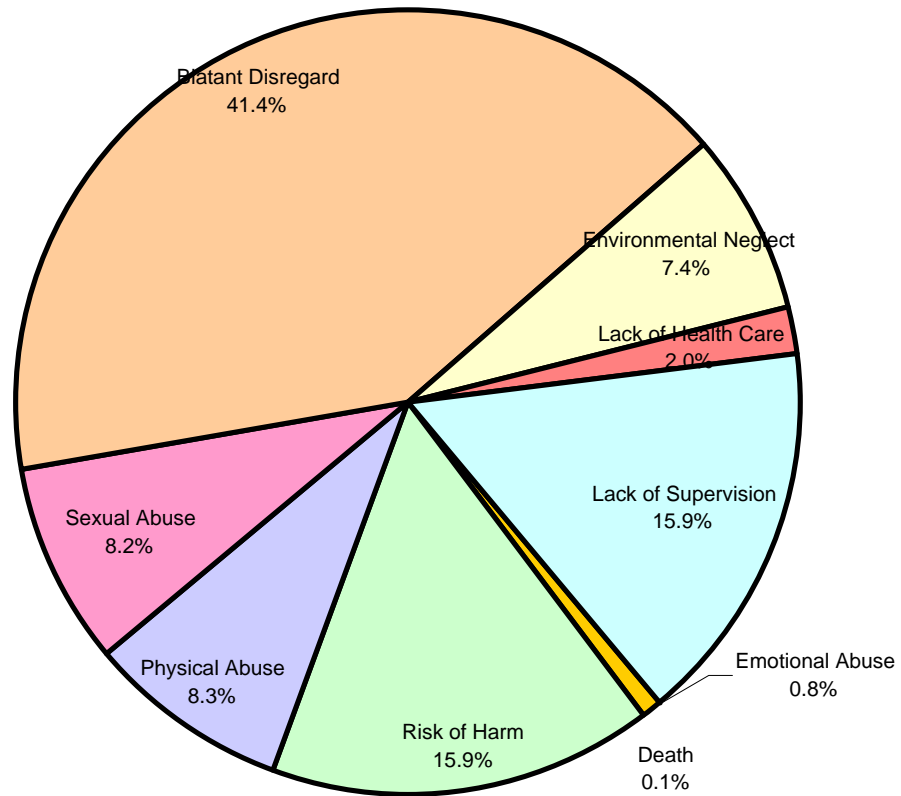
