

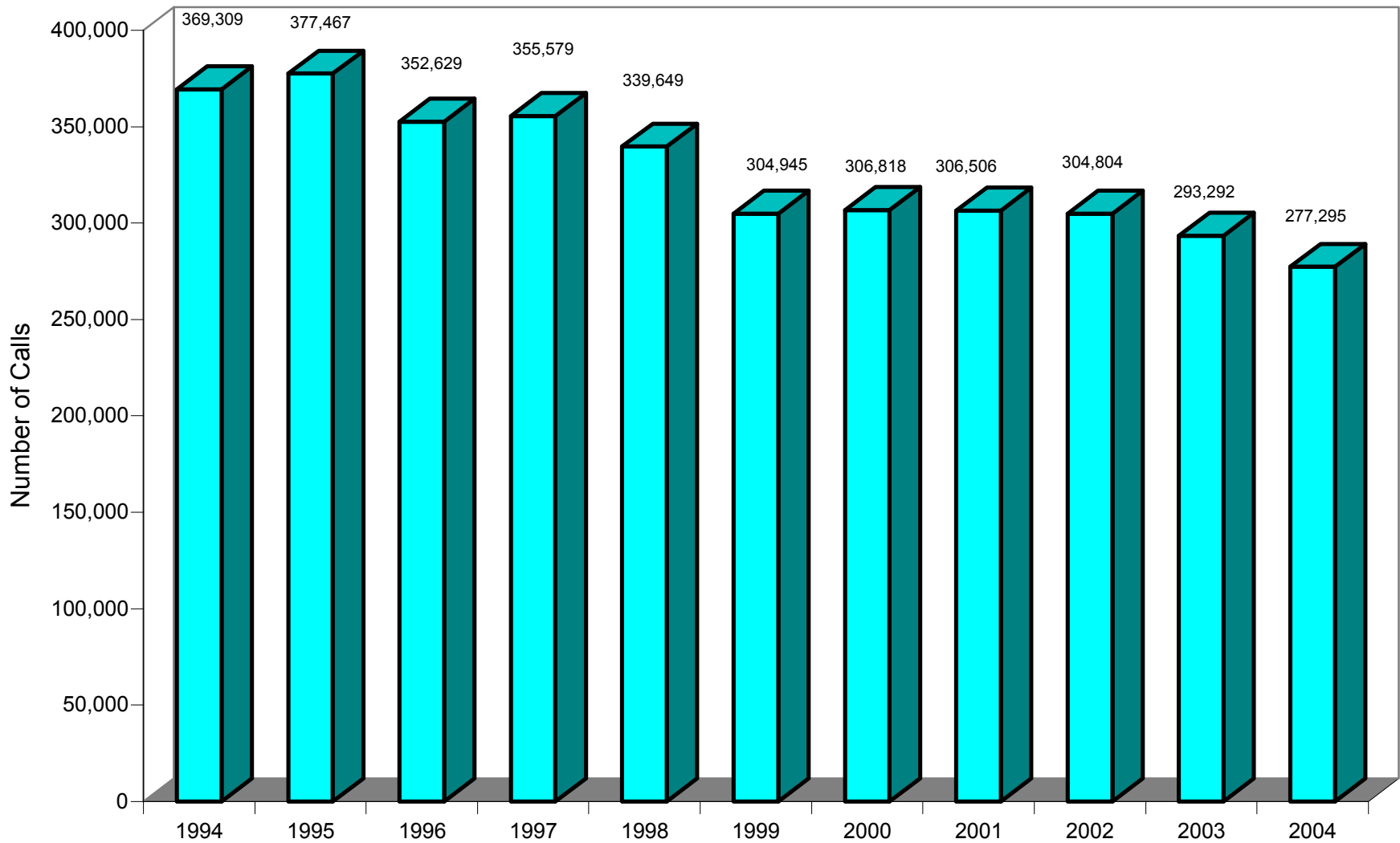
Child Abuse and Neglect Statistics Annual Report—Fiscal Year 2004

Introduction

Welcome to the online edition of the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services' Child Abuse and Neglect Statistics Annual Report for Fiscal Year 2004. This is a unique resource for tracking child abuse and neglect trends in Illinois, including demographic information about child victims and perpetrators.

Although the Fiscal Year 2004 version of this annual report omits text found in earlier annual reports, it features updates of the same tables and charts, with their accompanying reference labels for easy comparison.

Fiscal Year 2004

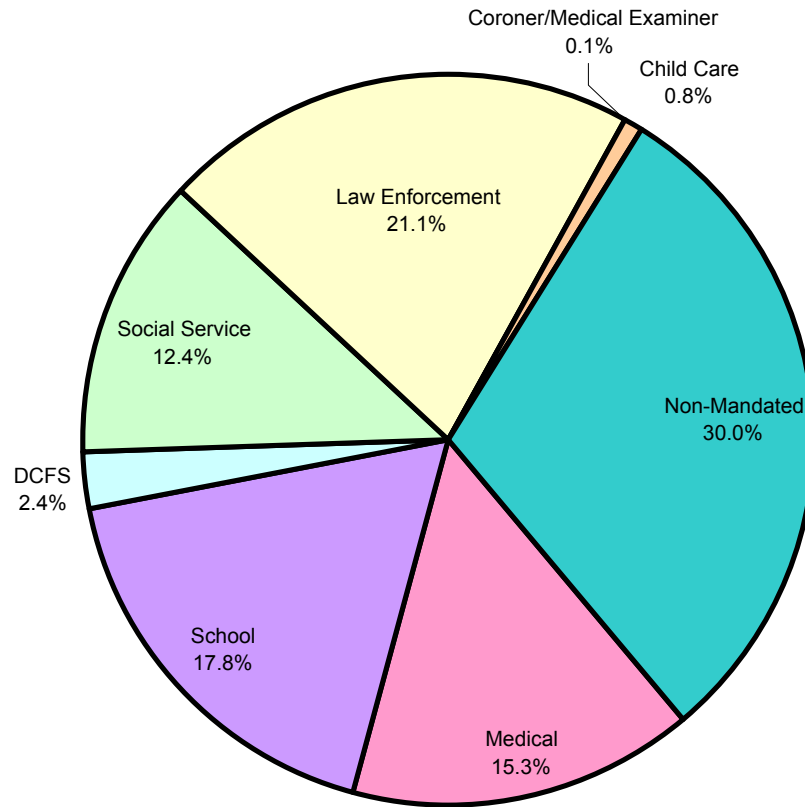

Fiscal Year 2004

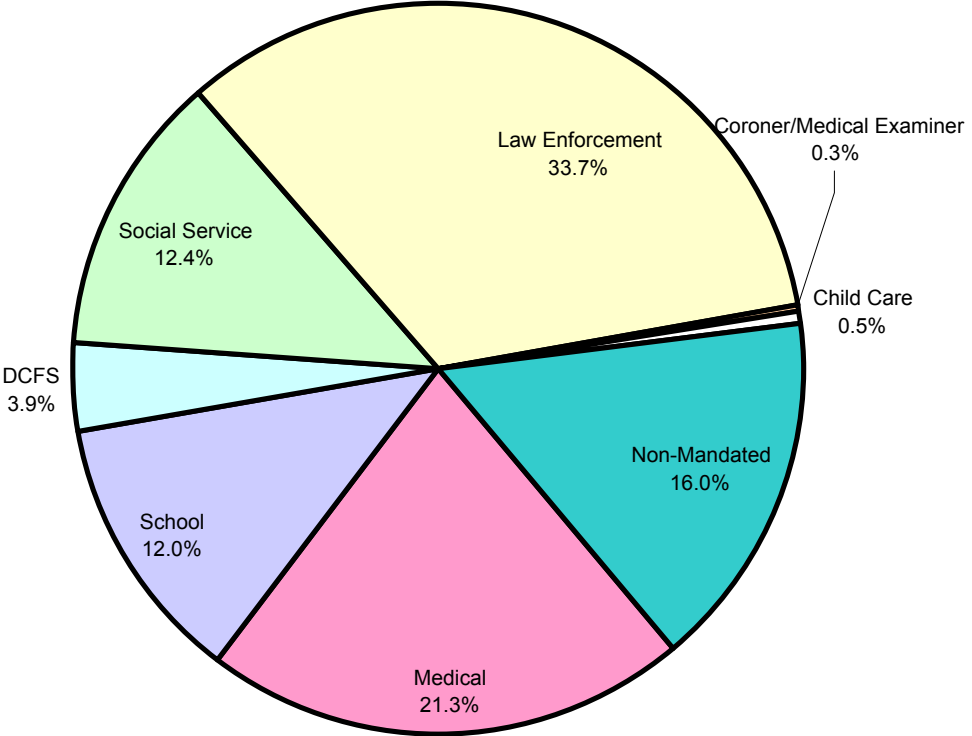

Fiscal Year 2004

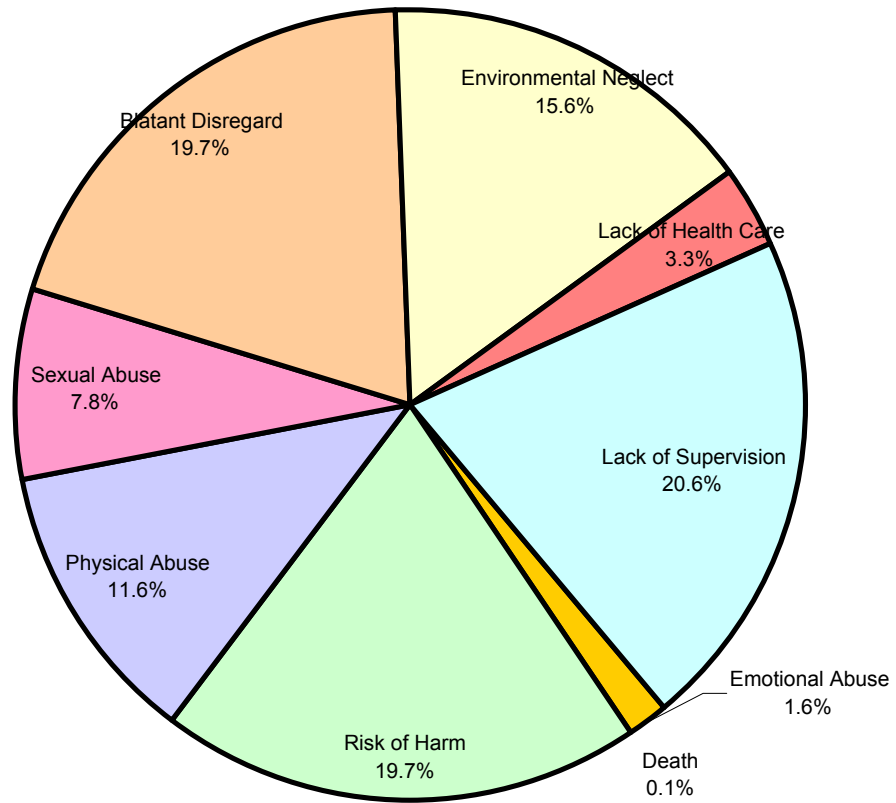
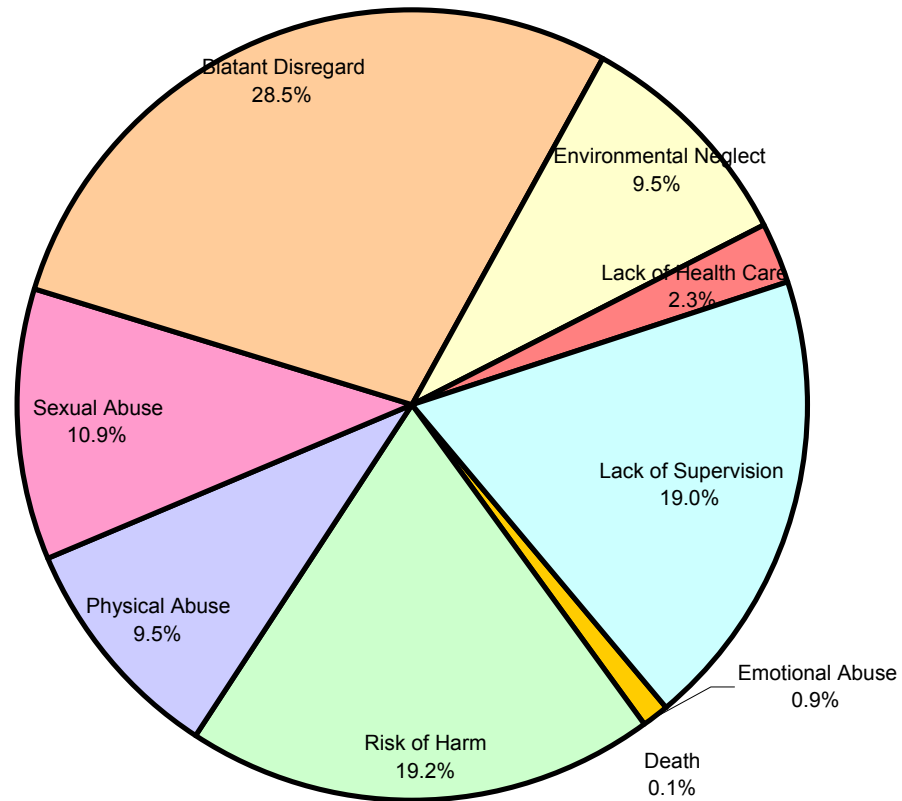
