Small Tests of Change: Using the Model for Improvement

Agency/Site

A Key Challenge in the implementation of family-centered, trauma-informed, strength-based child welfare practice:

Overall strategy being tested to address this challenge

Now it is time to turn this strategy into one or multiple small tests of change that can be accomplished by "Next Tuesday." The tests begin as very small tests of change, typically involving one child, family, caseworker, or clinician.

Individual Tests

PLAN Who is going to do it?

What is going to be done?

Where will it be done?

When will it be done?

Hypotheses (What do we expect to happen?)

How will you study/measure your small test?

HANDOUT #10: Small Tests of Change Worksheet

DO

What did we do?

Who did it?

When was it completed?

STUDY

Use the DATA, reflect and ask yourself:

- What happened?
- Did what you expect to happen actually happen?

ACT/ADJUST What did you learn?

- What needs to be adjusted and how for your next small test cycle?
- If the small test worked, how will you test it out again, more broadly?
 - With a different audience?
 - With multiple clinicians?
 - With multiple clients?
